NOTICE OF ORAL EX PARTE COMMUNICATIONS

Dear Ms. Dortch:

I am writing to notify the Office of the Secretary that earlier today I spoke with Erika Olsen, Acting Legal Advisor to Chairman Kevin J. Martin, to present the views of the Wireless Communications Association International, Inc. (“WCA”) with respect to the above-referenced petition by Globalstar, Inc. (“Globalstar”) for a rulemaking that would, *inter alia*, permit Globalstar to operate an Ancillary Terrestrial Component (“ATC”) on spectrum its satellite service shares with the Broadband Radio Service (“BRS”). I reiterated WCA’s opposition to allowing Globalstar to utilize spectrum at or adjacent to the BRS allocation at 2496-2500 MHz for the reasons reflected in WCA’s formal filings in this proceeding. I emphasized that given the state of the record before the Commission, issuance of a *Notice of Proposed Rulemaking* proposing to change the Commission’s 2004 decisions regarding BRS/ATC sharing would be a poor use of valuable Commission resources and would have an adverse impact on the deployment of innovative new BRS and Advanced Wireless Service services.
