WCA Confirms Featured Speakers For *WCA 2007*

WASHINGTON, DC (April 19, 2007) – More than 80 speakers have been confirmed to lead high-level debates at *WCA 2007* – the wireless broadband industry’s premier global convention, organized by the [Wireless Communications Association International](http://www.wcai.com) (WCA) from June 12-15 in Washington, DC.

Celebrating its 20th anniversary, this industry’s largest and oldest annual event will feature leaders of the most advanced WiMAX service providers in the U.S. and internationally, as well as major system integrators using advanced networks of all kinds, financiers, solution providers and end-user customers from major applications such as education and public safety, and top government officials from around the world. Kicking off the show on June 12 will be the WCA’s fourth *Carrier Investment Forum* that will focus on the best opportunities for financial investment into broadband wireless. Speakers will include high-level executives from world’s leading financial institutions, including The World Bank and Comerica Bank. The Forum will facilitate relationship building between financiers, analysts and broadband wireless providers, especially international carriers seeking funding to build out the most promising growth markets.

This year’s event will be broken into several tracks:

The GovMAX Track will illustrate the broadband needs of major government enterprises and will be of particular value to *WCA 2007* attendees who sell to the military and similar government procurement officials or who are willing to get into the market. It will feature high-level officials from both the government and the industry, including the FCC, U.S. Department of Agriculture and NTIA, as well as Cisco Systems, ArrayComm and FiberTower.

The WiMAX Track will open with a keynote-level CEO Roundtable, where the WiMAX industry’s leading experts will discuss the challenges and opportunities of deploying high-speed broadband wireless networks globally. Other track topics include: business breakthroughs and investment options, major WiMAX trials results, content as killer app, and international operator lessons learned.

The International Track will convene global WiMAX/4G industry leaders from over 40 nations to explore 4G international opportunities and deployments, as well as continue its work under the auspices of the WCA’s [Global Development Committee](#) toward providing greater global spectrum harmonization, freedom from interference and interoperability in broadband wireless spectrum bands internationally.

The Technical Track will gather the industry’s top tech experts to discuss, among other things, next steps on WiMAX certification, 4G technology choices, and international impact of standards on next generation network deployment.

Preceding this year's event on June 11 will be a Golf Tournament organized by Alexander Graham Bell Association in cooperation with WCA and DigitalBridge Communications, followed by a DigitalBridge Network Operations Center site tour with CEO Kelly Dunne.
